

The Gandhi Centre was set up on 2 October, 2011 with the primary objective of establishing, reviving and strengthening cultural relations between India and Netherlands. The Indian Council for Cultural Relations has set up 36 Indian cultural centres in different parts of the world.

The objective of the Gandhi Centre is to promote awareness of India's composite cultural heritage in The Netherlands. The activities of the cultural centre include showcasing various art forms of India such as dance, drama, music, films, talks and seminars on subjects related to India. The centre also teaches Yoga, Tabla and Hindi. It has a library with a rich collection of books on history, art, culture, political affairs and fiction. The Gandhi Centre functions under the Embassy of India and is established by the ICCR.

ICCR FOUNDATION DAY 2020

The Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) was founded on April 9, 1950 by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, independent India's first Education Minister. Its objectives are: to actively participate in the formulation and implementation of policies and programmes pertaining to India's cultural relations; to foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries; to promote cultural exchanges with other countries and people; and to develop relations with nations.

On this day, the ICCR Alumni from The Netherlands will send video messages on their experiences during their study in India under ICCR sponsorship, their art and their Gurus. They will also talk on where their scholarship has taken them in terms of profession and present themselves or their students' performance. Lavani is a genre of music popular in Maharashtra, India. Lavani is derived from the word *lavanya* which means beauty. According to another tradition, it is derived from Marathi *lavene*. Lavani is a combination of traditional song and dance, which particularly performed to the beats of *Dholki*, a percussion instrument. Lavani is noted for its powerful rhythm. Lavani has contributed substantially to the development of Marathi folk theatre. In Maharashtra and southern Madhya Pradesh, it is performed by the female performers wearing nine-yard long sarees. The songs are sung in a quick tempo.

SHRI RAMCHARITMANAS is an epic poem in the Awadhi language, composed by the 16th Century Indian bhakti poet Goswami Tulsidas (c.1532–1623). The word Ramcharitmanas literally means "lake of the deeds of Rama". It is considered as one of the greatest works of Hindi literature and to be the best work on devotion by Mahatma Gandhi.

Shri Ramcharitmanas is an epic poem in the Awadhi language, composed by the 16th-century Indian bhakti poet Goswami Tulsidas (c. 1532–1623). The word *Ramcharitmanas* literally means "Lake of the deeds of Rama". It is considered as one of the greatest works of Hindi literature. *Ramcharitmanas* consists of seven Kānds. The first two parts, **Bāl Kāṇḍ** (Childhood Episode) and **Ayodhyā Kāṇḍ** (Ayodhya Episode), make up more than half of the work. The other parts are **Araṇya Kāṇḍ** (Forest Episode), **Kiśkindhā Kāṇḍ** (Kishkindha Episode), **Sundar Kāṇḍ** (Pleasant Episode), **Laṅkā Kāṇḍ** (Lanka Episode), and **Uttar Kāṇḍ** (Later Episode).

Ms. Hem Vats, Hindi Teacher at The Gandhi Centre with her in-depth knowledge on Shri Ramcharitmanas backed by her good singing talent would recite the Bal Kand paying tribute to Ram Navami, the birth of Lord Ram on April 2 and World Heritage Day on April 18.

Yoga Classes


Yoga is a science and art of healthy living with origins in ancient India. It is a stress management therapy and its practice increase immunity and contributes to overall physical and mental being.
