OPENING REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT OF INDIA SHRI RAM NATH KOVIND AT LUNCH HOSTED BY PRIME MINISTER OF THE NETHERLANDS, H.E. MARK RUTTE

Our new-age partnership must act to combine the resources, expertise and knowledge with the skill to address contemporary challenges, add strategic direction to the cooperation, and maximize benefits for both countries.

Excellency, India is a land of opportunities as well as aspirations. India offers growth in scale, ambition and results. We welcome the Netherlands to be part of our growth story. As home to one-fifth of the world's youth population, the needs and aspirations of the young Indians are critical to the future of India and the world at large. Young Indians are driving a culture of innovation, entrepreneurship and diversity. I have learnt that many of the young Indians are joining universities, start-ups and businesses in the Netherlands.
